Boys & Girls Club of Greater Green Bay	Girls on the Run/Zspace	Funding will support the implementation zSpace, an interactive learning system that provides hands-on experiential learning in STEAM content areas and Girls on the Run, which connects girls with positive adult female mentors through after-school run/walks and in turn increases their physical endurance as they develop self-confidence and key life skills.
Children's Promise	Soy Resistente-I Am Resilient	Funding will provide participants with access to strong Latino women leaders in our community, who model healthy social-emotional Participants will meet to discuss their cultural roots, self-worth, choices when observing or experiencing student-to-student conflict and healthy social media choices.
Encompass Early Education and Care	Changing Lives One Crockpot at a Time	Funding will be used to purchase items that align with personal goals set by families with their Family Advocate. These resources are items they could not afford but would greatly enhance their lives such as a cookbook, a crockpot along with a cooking lesson from their Advocate, hygiene items, laundry soap and basket, an activity for their child, a gift card for a meal out with a friend, Bay Beach tickets, or a baseball glove.
Evergreen Productions	Girls in Technical Theater	Funds will support the Girls in Technical Theatre program and cover the costs of supplies for workshops, a small stipend to workshop leaders and program administrator, tickets to attend productions, and transportation to out-of-town productions.
Foundations Health & Wholeness	Mental Health Support Groups for Women Experiencing Homelessness	Funding will support the continuation of a regular Women's Empowerment therapy/support groups at St. John's Shelter/Micah Center, House of Hope, or New Community Shelter. The group will help women experiencing homelessness work on healthy relationships, develop self-esteem, and address trauma.
Girls on the Run Northeast Wisconsin	Girls on the Run in Brown County	Funds will support fostering an inclusive program experience for 6 program sites across Brown County, providing bus transportation to the Celebration 5K in November and providing participants with shoes, sports bras, or proper running apparel, if needed.
Greater Green Bay YMCA	Caregiver-Child Weekend	Funding will support children and their female adult caregivers in a weekend of bonding and wellness at resident Camp U-Nah-Li-Ya. Twenty youth from the Green Bay YMCA's 21st Century Community Learning Centers, 90% from low-income households, will have the opportunity to experience Wisconsin's Northwoods with their female adult caregiver.
Green Bay Area Public Schools	Paraeducator Program	Funds will support the Paraeducator Program and ongoing career advancement opportunities for District staff. The current cohort would have adequate technology to complete the remaining coursework, funds to cover license fees and the opportunity to have a graduation celebration.
House of Hope Green Bay	Barrier Removal Funds	House of Hope will assist youth and families experiencing homelessness to remove barriers created by past evictions, rental arrears, and other financial hardships that limit or eliminate their ability to access safe, stable housing and gainful employment.
Jake's Network of Hope	Hygiene Products to Empower Women, Girls	Funding will provide kits of tampons and pads to local schools. In the warehouse, the products are repackaged into discreet, cloth pencil bags so girls can conceal the items while taking products they need during school.
Wisconsin Doula Association	Virtual Childbirth and Lactation Classroom	This grant will be used to help numerous nonprofit and community partners in supporting women/families to access a free childbirth education class and lactation class for the next 12 months.
