Cycling Without Age Door County	Purchase of a Trailer for Transporting and Storing Trishaw Bicycles	The ability to transport and store trishaws in central locations throughout Door County is more difficult each season. In order to reach as many potential riders as possible, it is imperative to be able to move the trishaws from partner agency to partner agency. Purchasing a trailer will allow the organization to transport, safely park, and store all three trishaws in convenient locations closer to the routes, partner agencies, and special events throughout Door County.
Door County Memorial Hospital Ministry Health Care	Memory Informed Community Health Access Program	MICHAP is a Community Paramedicine program, which will enhance the overall health of those living in the Northern Door County community and coping with chronic conditions and cognitive impairment. This program will expand dementia education in the Northern Door community and support continued evaluation and treatment of those coping with dementia while living independently. This is a partnership led by DCMC's Memory Care and Door County Emergency Medical Services.
Door-Tran	Transportation Programs 2023-2024	Covered program expenses include staff time to register clients, coordinate trips, and perform background/driver record checks; mileage, meal, and cell phone reimbursements as well as excess auto liability insurance policy for volunteer drivers; driver training and recognition, tracking trip data and office hours in Northern Door.
Maritime Museum & Lighthouse Preservation Society	SPARK! of Door County	DCMM is seeking funding to bring the highly successful, multi-state SPARK! program to Door County. SPARK! creates educational programming for adults with early to mid-stage dementia and Alzheimer's disease and their caregivers, so they can experience museum-grade, tactile activities that will create a lasting impact. Funding would support training for staff, purchasing educational activity materials, and travel reimbursement between host locations.
Washington Island Community Health Program	Washington Island Community Health Program-2023	Funding will be used to help seniors of Washington Island to remain in their homes and community safely and independently by partially supporting the part-time salaries of the Executive Director, Office Manager/Bookkeeper, and Program/Events Coordinator while they provide community health services, education, and assistance to Island residents, as well as some of our Professional fees. As WICHP grows and service demands increase, there is the potential to expand the hours of our employees.
