

## Crime Prevention Recipients 2023

Applicant	Project	Summary
Big Brothers Big Sisters of NEW	Crime Prevention Support	Funds would assist in the support and recruitment of adult mentors (Bigs) into the one-to-one youth mentoring program. Through these mentoring relationships, young individuals are empowered to make positive choices, build resilience, and avoid the path of criminal activities.
Boys & Girls Club of Greater Green Bay	Pop-Up Barbershop	Starz Barber & Beauty would provide a pop-up barbershop "open" during Family Nights throughout the 2023-2024 school year. Haircuts would be free for middle and high school Club members at the Lutsey Clubhouse on the east side of Green Bay. This would be a new Club amenity, focused on nurturing inclusivity and building healthy self-esteem through social connectedness, informal mentoring, and relationship building in a judgement-free zone.
Children's Museum of Green Bay	EAT: Tabletops to Cops	EAT: Tabletops to Cops provides the opportunity for families to build positive connections with law enforcement officers, enjoy a healthy meal, play in the museum's exhibits, and participate in educational activities. Funding would open access to the museum at no charge.
Children's Promise	Soy Resistente-I Am Resilient	Grant dollars would support an expansion of programming to male Latino students at Edison Middle School. Soy Resistente increases school connectivity for participating students, while decreasing the likelihood of high-risk behaviors. In a collaboration between Casa ALBA Melanie, Children's Promise, My Brother's Keeper, and counselors at Edison Middle School, participating students explore cultural identity, self-esteem, conflict resolution and social media safety.
Family Services of Northeast Wisconsin	Child Abuse Prevention Education	This program, through the Willow Tree Cornerstone Child Advocacy Center, empowers children across Northeast Wisconsin with knowledge and skills that help protect them from various types of child abuse and crime. It includes facilitated school-based support groups as well as classroom prevention presentations, provides children with the tools, confidence, and knowledge to speak up if they are uncomfortable with a situation.
Foundations Health & Wholeness	Partnering with Local Youth to Prevent Crime	Funding would expand outreach efforts in the Brown County region to improve youth support and available resources for youth in the region. The primary goals of RAYS are preventive education services and secondary crisis intervention, which ultimately lowers the likelihood of high-risk behaviors among youth. These funds will help provide tangible resources for youth enrolled.







Girl Scouts of the Northwestern Great Lakes	Reaching Out: Providing Girls with a Roadmap to Resiliency	Reaching Out provides girls with a roadmap to resiliency by arming them with skills they need to make healthy choices, build supportive relationships, and live according to their values. The program provides girls with opportunities to develop foundational leadership skills and provides them with an entry point for social and emotional support.
Golden House	Prevention Education	To help young adults prevent victimization in their intimate partner relationships, Golden House will provide evidence-based and innovative relationship building programming. The Prevention Coordinator is dedicated to ending relationship abuse by educating, empowering, and activating young people in a movement for change.
Greater Green Bay YMCA	21C Fridays	Funds would support two sites to engage students on Fridays when there is a significant drop in attendance. The students not attending the program are often still on the playground or in the neighborhood, but not always making good decisions (e.g., fights or vandalism). On days with events or field trips, there is 95% attendance. Next school year, Fun Fridays will include field trips and student choice activities.
Howe Community Resource Center	2023 Trunk or Treat	Trunk or Treat is held every year on the Friday before Halloween in the parking lot of the campus. It was started after hearing from the neighborhood that they needed a safe place to participate in trick or treating. The event has grown, with over 2,500 people attending last year. Howe seeks to offer a safe alternative to trick or treating while always providing an opportunity for community members to connect.
Volunteer Center of Brown County	Reading Coaches for Kids	The program connects volunteer tutors with Brown County schoolchildren to help create a greater sense of belonging, increase children's literacy skills, and enhance the community. This program works through personalized attention, targeted instruction, and extra encouragement.
We All Rise: African American Resource Center	Safety Throughout Transition	All Seasons Transformation is a 49-bed transitional living facility providing programming that will lead men to be empowered to retain their independence. Funding would replace the current security system.
West De Pere High School	SADD Every 15 Minutes Program	This program focuses on helping students learn the consequences of distracted or drunk driving. It includes a simulation of a car crash, and students witness how friends and families would be impacted. This helps students make legal and safe choices in their future.
Wilder Park Neighborhood Association	Child ID/Newsletter	Wilder Association would promote child safety providing Child ID kits to the parents who attend the various events held at the park during the summer. With the number of incidents involving children it is important to have up-to-date information on your child, including photos, DNA, personal data and more. The organization would like to make 300+ Child ID kits available to parents.
