School	Project	Summary
Aldo Leopold Community School	Books and Breakfast	Select students will be invited to school early one day a week to receive literacy intervention and enrichment to help them grow as learners and a special breakfast from a guest "cook". Dr. Rosa Minoka-Hill School	Dr. Rosa Minoka-Hill School	Minoka-Hill School is a school for students that are building their coping skills and strategies while learning about themselves. We want to create positive opportunities for them to build relationships with staff, students and their identified family. Funding will be used to purchase a popcorn maker for family engagement nights, celebration days, and build a student led concession shop to gain hands-on job skills.
East High School	Sources of Strength Suicide Awareness	The Suicide Awareness Student Support Club will promote school wide activities centered around Sources of Strength (SOS). These activities include a Thankfulness Campaign, Sticky Note Positive event, and an Annual Mental Health Fair during all student lunches. We hope to increase positive protective behaviors for students who may have a history of suicidal ideation, connectedness to adults, and increase school engagement.
Edison Middle School	6th Grade Physics Day	A physics day at Bay Beach offers at-risk 6th graders a unique opportunity to apply their classroom learning of forces and motion in a hands-on, interactive environment. This educational excursion is designed to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world application, making science come alive for these students.
Howe Elementary	Read Your Heart Out	Funding will be used for the Read Your Heart Out program which raises awareness and family engagement in the area of literacy. In the past, Howe has hosted an all-school assembly featuring student's learning on Black history, guest performances (African dance or drumming), a soul food lunch for parents & community members, STEAM projects featuring African American leaders &, most importantly, each scholar goes home with a book to remember the day & share with family.
MacArthur Elementary	Family Learning Nights	Grant funds will be used for family learning nights where parents and guardians bring their children in for dinner and a craft activity while learning valuable tools for their behavior management toolbox from a presenter utilizing curricula from Parenting the Love and Logic Way.



Southwest High School	Southwest High School Intellectual Disability Program	Funding will allow the Intellectual Disability program " the community club" to increase and expand our current coffee shop and bakery model at Southwest high school in Green Bay. The vision is to combine with our feeder school Lombardi middle school and the Autism focus program to create more real-life jobs and life skills that continue to grow with the students ability levels.
Washington Middle School	Washington Welcome Kits for New Multilingual Learners	Funding will support the second-ever "Welcome to Washington" Engagement Night for our students who were new to the country. Last year, over 50 students and families attended and based on their feedback, we are adding more information about community resources, scholarships, and school safety.
Webster Elementary Children's Center for Integrated Arts	Tanya Paral Art Gallery	Tanya Paral graced Webster Elementary with her artistic passion and teaching until she lost her battle with cancer in 2022. The school is creating a dedicated art gallery in her memory. Funds are needed to help purchase items such as paint, track gallery lighting, shelving, and devices for hanging art to help transform the space. This gallery space will be used to display student artwork throughout the school year.
