Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northeast Wisconsin	Crime Prevention Support	Funding will support the expansion of the REACH program, which aims to divert youth from the justice system. This mentoring approach not only builds positive relationships but also empowers youth with essential life skills, helping them make informed choices and avoid involvement in the juvenile justice system.
Boys & Girls Club of Greater Green Bay	2024 Pop Up Barber Shop	Funding will support a pop-up barber shop to be "open" during Family Nights and other special events throughout the 2024-2025 school year. Haircuts will be free for middle and high school Club members at Green Bay's east and west side Clubhouses, representing an expansion from last year's pilot program on the east side of town.
CASA of Brown County	Real World Panel	Funding will provide youth and young adults who have experienced foster care with tools to share their story. A Real Word Speakers Panel is comprised of young adults who currently live or have lived in foster care after experiencing abuse, abandonment, or neglect by their parents or caregivers. The panel training to local foster care youth and young adults will empower them to use their voice to make a positive, lasting impact in our community.
Children's Museum of Green Bay	EAT: Tabletops to Cops & Police Car Exhibit	Funding will support EAT: Tabletops to Cops and a new police car exhibit. EAT offers families free access to the children's museum, allowing them to forge positive relationships with law enforcement officers, enjoy nutritious meals, explore interactive museum exhibits, and engage in educational activities. The Police Car Exhibit will provide a hands-on opportunity for children to explore the job duties of a police officer.
Empowered Tutoring	Shoulders to Stand On - Tutoring Program at Green Bay West High School	Funding will support the Shoulders to Stand On tutoring program. This program aims to provide educational support and mentorship to at-risk youth in our community. By offering personalized tutoring sessions, mentorship opportunities, and access to resources, Shoulders to Stand On empowers young individuals to excel academically and make positive life choices.
Foundations Health & Wholeness	RAYS Youth Services - Brown County	Funding will support youth outreach efforts in Brown County to improve education, support, & critical resources for youth. The primary goals of RAYS are preventative education services and secondary crisis intervention, which ultimately lowers the likelihood of high-risk behaviors amongst youth.
Howe Community Resource Center	Safety First Program	Funding will support the Home Visiting Program, which is dedicated to reducing child abuse and neglect, by providing at-risk families with the necessary resources and support to create safe and nurturing home environments.



Safe Families for Children--Northeast Wisconsin	Building Healthy and Sustainable Family Units in Brown County	Funding will support efforts to decrease child abuse and neglect within Brown County by increasing the organization's capacity to onboard volunteers, allowing the organization to build networks of community support around families at risk of committing crimes against children.
Volunteer Center of Brown County	Reading Coaches for Kids	Funding would support the increased demand for Reading Coaches in local schools. Reading Coaches for Kids matches volunteer tutors with students for personalized, one-on-one sessions, directly impacts educational outcomes for children in Brown County.
Youth Empowerment Summit	My Story Matters	Funding would support the "My Story Matters" program, a transformative storytelling and writing workshop dedicated to empowering youth by providing a structured environment where young participants cultivate their personal narratives, recognize their unique strengths, and strive towards achieving their dreams.
