



2025 A visual representation of homelessness in Brown County, WI

Homelessness is a growing crisis in Brown County. The Brown County Homeless and Housing Coalition is a community partnership working toward ending homelessness and housing insecurity.

HOW WE MEASURE SUCCESS

We will prevent homelessness from occurring whenever possible, and when we can't prevent it, we will work to ensure the experience of homelessness is RARE, BRIEF, and NON-RECURRING.







The percentage of people returning to homelessness within 2 years of moving into permanent housing in Brown County is **DECLINING**.



This pie chart shows that the vast majority of people utilizing homeless services in Brown County lived in the community prior to entering service here.



3 in 5 experienced homelessness for the first time




Nearly 2 in 3 homeless adults were living with a disability

RACIAL DISPARITIES

Homelessness disproportionately impacts people of color.

The chart below compares the rate of homelessness by race and ethnicity, per 10,000. People who identify as Black or African American are **14x more likely** to experience homelessness compared to those who identify as White.
